School age is a fabulous time for students to learn about healthy eating.

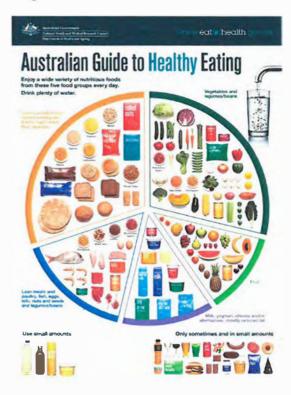
This term we have been focusing on the healthy eating food models including the Australian Guide to Healthy Eating.

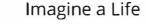

I have replaced Una who many of you would know as one of the foundation Pastoral Team members when the school opened in 2015.

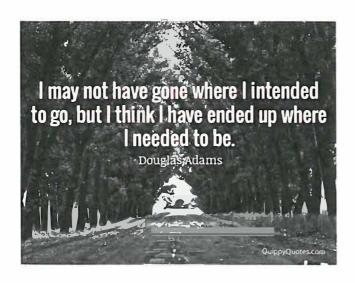
As St Francis' School is such a unique place to be, my first two terms have primarily been a learning journey getting to know the school community.

At STFS, we encourage our students to take responsibility for themselves and their actions. At times, we have students calling or messaging parents during classes or break times asking to be picked up or to leave the school and go home.

Looking for work or a career change? Can you see yourself working in a school?
