During the long break, your teenage son &/or daughter will spend

much more time in isolation in their bedrooms. This is normal teenage behaviour. However, during this time they are often on their phones and making connections with people they have not met or are ever likely to meet.

Whilst risk taking and increased non-sharing is a normal part of

being a teenager, at least "back in the day" parents, if inclined, could ask who our child was spending time with and often has the opportunity to meet the parents, meet the young person and make some kid of assessment around whether that person was suitable for our child to be around. With mobile phones, the opportunity to 'check out' our child's friend or family has been severed, shutting us out even more from our child's life. Although the time of being a teenager is a time of transition with increased independence and autonomy, teenagers

still need the guidance and protection of their parents.

Susan McClean was a member of the Victoria Police for 27 years and is Australia's foremost expert in the area of cyber safety. Susan's website has many great resources and advice for parents around current concerns involving our young people and the use of modern social media. There are short videos ranging from laws and legislation, sexting and sending nudes, to grooming and online predators.

Susan's shared knowledge is particularly important considering the safety

Our St Francis School breakfast club is open every day from 8am until 8:50am in our Common Room. Breakfast Club is open to everyone and is a relaxed atmosphere for the students to start their day. A health breakfast is provided for students who may otherwise arrive to school hungry or needing that extra

energy boost before heading off to class. Research shows that one in seven children arrive at school

without eating breakfast, which can affect their learning and attendance. Our school has been running the school breakfast club for quite a few years now. It is led by the school Youth Workers as well as staff and students who volunteer their time to help out. Most days we have a simple continental breakfast (toast,

cereal, eggs or a smoothie, fresh fruit) and others we do a cook up (BBQ, pancakes, omelettes, waffles, fruit cups, avocado toast) or any other ideas suggested by the students.





This year has been a tremendous year with so many achievements for our school, staff and students. We have such a dynamic and exciting school, offering all students wide and varied learning experiences in a safe and welcoming environment. Throughout the year it has been important for the Youth Worker team to bring a variety of

activities, service suggestions and referrals to the finger tips of our young people.


From the STFS Admin Team...
